6. Accommodation

Participants are strongly encouraged to stay in the districts of Las Condes, Providencia or Vitacura, which are well-connected and recommended for visitors. The venue is located just one block from Metro Line 1, at La Moneda station, providing excellent access from these neighbourhoods.

We highly recommend staying in Las Condes, particularly around the El Golf area, which offers great amenities and convenient metro connections.

The following hotels offer special participant rates:

Additionally, anywhere in Las Condes close to Line 1 is a great option. Vitacura, especially near the intersection of Avenida Vitacura and Alonso de Córdova, is another attractive and upscale neighbourhood, with good bus connections to the venue. Providencia, close to Line 1 stations, provides a wide range of accommodation choices and is a convenient alternative.

7. Airport Arrivals And Departures

Santiago International Airport (Arturo Merino Benítez) is located about 30–40 minutes from the recommended hotels, depending on traffic.

- Upon arrival, please use only official taxis or shuttle services booked at the airport counters, or arrange your taxi directly through your hotel.
- Details on official transportation can be found at Nuevo Pudahuel.



8. VISA, IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS

- All delegates must carry a valid passport with at least six months of validity from their date of arrival.
- If a visa is required, delegates should begin the application process as early as possible and may contact the Chilean consulate or the contact listed in Section 4 for assistance.
- Upon arrival, you will be required to complete a Customs and Agricultural Declaration. Chile maintains strict phytosanitary controls to protect its agriculture; therefore, you

must declare any animal or plant products you are carrying. This declaration can also be completed online, on the day of your arrival or the day before, at: https://dj.sag.gob.cl/declaracion-jurada.

• Foreign currency in excess of US\$10,000 must also be declared.

For detailed customs information, please consult Chilean Customs.

9. Local Transport

- Santiago has a modern Metro system with six lines. The Metro is a convenient way to get around, especially during busy traffic hours. (It's a good idea to keep an eye on your belongings.)
- Buses and the Metro use the rechargeable BIP Card, available at any metro station. You
 can also download the RED Movilidad app https://www.red.cl/acerca-de-red/app-red/
- Taxis are generally safe, but it is advisable to ask the hotel to book a taxi at night.
- Apps such as Uber, Cabify are also widely used.

11. General Information About Santiago

Santiago is the capital and largest city of Chile, with a population of around 8 million in Greater Santiago, roughly 40% of the country's total population of 19.5 million. The city lies in Chile's central valley, at an elevation ranging from approximately 500 metres (1,640 feet) to 650 metres (2,133 feet) above sea level.

Santiago is a diverse and cosmopolitan city, with contrasting neighbourhoods that showcase both its rich history and modern development. You will find a wide variety of art galleries, design boutiques and handicraft markets, along with an extensive choice of restaurants, cafés, and bars. Neighbourhoods worth exploring include El Centro (the historic city centre), Bellavista, Lastarria, Providencia, Las Condes and Vitacura.



At the heart of the city's business district is the 'El Golf' area, located where the districts of Las Condes and Vitacura meet. While primarily a commercial and office hub rather than a tourist hotspot, El Golf offers a glimpse into local urban life, with high-end restaurants, quality shops, and green spaces. The skyline in this area features modern and innovative architecture.

Providencia is a lively neighbourhood with boutique shops, cafés, and numerous restaurants. It is also home to the Costanera Centre, a major commercial complex that includes Latin America's tallest building, the Gran Torre Costanera. Visitors can enjoy panoramic views from its observation deck, Sky Costanera, and shop in the large mall at its base. Further into Las Condes, you will find two other major shopping centres: Parque Arauco and Alto Las Condes, both offering a wide range of retail, dining, and entertainment options.

If time permits, consider exploring the more colourful and historic areas of Bellavista, Lastarria, and El Centro. These neighbourhoods are especially popular with visitors and are well connected to the Santiago Metro network.

Santiago is also known for its extensive parks and green spaces, where locals gather to exercise or relax. Two popular options are Parque Bicentenario and Parque Araucano, both offering pleasant green areas and family-friendly facilities.

12. Weather In November


November in Santiago generally offers warm and pleasant spring weather, with daytime temperatures ranging from 22°C to 25°C and cooler evenings between 9°C and 12°C. Rainfall is minimal, with only a few light showers expected during the month. Participants are encouraged to pack clothing suitable for mild, sunny days, along with a light jacket or sweater for cooler evenings.

13. Currency, Credit Cards And Tipping


- Local currency: Chilean Peso (CLP)
- Exchange rate: approximately US\$1 = CLP 960 (as of August 2025; rates fluctuate)
- Credit cards are widely accepted, and ATMs are available throughout the city.
- Tipping: 10% of the bill is customary in restaurants and cafés.

14. Electricity And Plugs

The standard voltage in Chile is 220 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. In Chile there are two associated plug types, types C and L. Plug type C is the plug with two round pins and type L is the plug with three round pins.
